

**DELTA CONVEYANCE FINANCE AUTHORITY  
NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ADOPT A  
CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Delta Conveyance Finance Authority (“Authority”) intends to adopt a Conflict of Interest Code pursuant to Government Code Section 87300.

A conflict of interest code designates those employees, members, officers and consultants who make or participate in the making of governmental decisions which may affect their financial interests, who must disclose those interests in financial disclosure statements, and who must disqualify themselves from making or participating in the making of governmental decisions affecting those interests.

The proposed Conflict of Interest Code (“Code”) will be considered by the Board of Directors of the Authority at a public hearing on December 14, 2018, at 11:30 a.m. at 1121 L Street, Suite 1045, Sacramento, California. Under the Code, designated officials, employees and consultants shall file an annual disclosure statement no later than April 1st of each year. Designated officials who manage public investments shall disclose financial interests in accordance with the filing procedures and disclosure criteria in the Political Reform Act, Government Code section 87200 et seq. Any interested person may be present and comment at the public hearing or may submit written comments concerning the proposed Code. Written comments must be submitted no later than December 28, 2018 at 5:00 p.m. The Code shall not be approved until after the end of the period outlined herein and the consideration of any public comment.
